# Single tickets on sale starting May 1 to the 2024 Brevard Music Center Summer Festival

Symphony, Opera, Chamber, Jazz, Bluegrass, and Broadway featured from June 1 to August 25

Brevard, North Carolina — The wait is over! On May 1, single tickets go on sale to the Brevard Music Center (BMC) 2024 Summer Festival at brevardmusic.org/tickets or by calling the BMC Box Office at 828.862.2105. The Box Office at Whittington-Pfohl Auditorium (Brevard Music Center Campus, 349 Andante Lane) will open beginning May 13 from 10:00 AM — 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. Tickets to the Summer Festival, which runs from June 1 through August 25, start at \$25.

This year's summer lineup at BMC — one of America's premiere music festivals — features a diverse offering of symphony, opera, chamber, jazz, bluegrass, and Broadway performances. Primary BMC performance venues include the 1800-seat, open-air Whittington-Pfohl Auditorium (with lawn seating) and the 400-seat Parker Concert Hall.

The season will be highlighted by Legendary Artist Wynton Marsalis, who will appear with The Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra in three extraordinary concerts from June 25-29. Lead by Artistic Director Keith Lockhart, additional June — August festival highlights include classical masterpieces Prokofiev Symphony No. 5, Copland's Appalachian Spring, Gershwin's Piano Concerto in F, Strauss's Ein Heldenleben, and a world premiere violin concerto by Errollyn Wallen; Janiec Opera Company productions of The Threepenny Opera, Flight, La Bohème, and An Evening of Jerome Kern and Friends; a family-friendly film + live orchestra presentation of Star Wars: The Empire Strikes Back in Concert; and BMC Presents lighter concert fare featuring Bryan Sutton, Judy Collins, Aoife O'Donovan, and Béla Fleck.

## **OPENING NIGHT: Lockhart Conducts Rachmaninoff and Prokofiev**

Opening Night sparkles as Keith Lockhart conducts Prokofiev's Fifth Symphony, at once lyrical, boisterous, and ultimately optimistic — in the words of the composer, "a symphony on the greatness of the human soul." Brevard favorite Joyce Yang returns to perform Rachmaninoff's 3rd Piano Concerto, widely regarded as the most technically challenging in all the repertoire.

#### Mendelssohn's "Scottish" Symphony

The distinctive sounds of the British Isles are featured in this Sunday matinee. Beginning in the far reaches of the Orkney Islands with Maxwell Davies's celebratory wedding romp complete with solo bagpipe, winding down through London in Vaughan Williams's pastoral yet capricious Oboe Concerto, and finishing back where we started with Mendelssohn's spirited Scottish Symphony, inspired by a walking tour of the countryside and a visit to the ruins of Edinburgh's Holyrood Chapel.

The Jazz at Lincoln Center Orchestra with Wynton Marsalis — an ensemble of 15 virtuoso instrumentalists — delivers unforgettable performances with a characteristic flair and authority developed over 35 years of unrivaled excellence. The group's compositions and arrangements embody an unprecedented variety of styles and genres including works by Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Mary Lou Williams, Dizzy Gillespie, and Benny Goodman, among so many, spanning jazz's entire documented history.

Violinist Tai Murray and members of BMC's Artist Faculty perform *A Fiddler's Tale*, Wynton's modern take on the old story about the artist who sells her soul to the devil, updated with some wonderful musical and narrative twists.

## **Legendary Artist Series | Lockhart Conducts Marsalis**

Keith Lockhart conducts the music of Wynton Marsalis in this momentous capstone concert of an extraordinary weeklong residency. Tai Murray makes her Brevard debut in Wynton's jazzy, bluesy Violin Concerto, a tour de force for orchestra and soloist. Then, Wynton and the JLCO join with Lockhart and the BMCO for Marsalis's masterwork "The Jungle," inspired by the fluid, pressure-packed, and cosmopolitan metropolis of New York City.

## Musical Magic: Favorite Music Featured in Disney's beloved Fantasia Movies

Disney's groundbreaking films *Fantasia* and *Fantasia* 2000 inspire this program of orchestral showpieces. Spirits dance and fly through the air as they are summoned to Bald Mountain. Volcanic fire rains down to the sounds of Stravinsky's colorful ballet. And who can forget Mickey Mouse as the sorcerer's apprentice, casting magical spells before learning how to control them. Buckets and mops multiply and come alive in this dreamscape by Paul Dukas.

## **BMC Presents: An Evening with Judy Collins**

In her sixth decade as an artist — and as prolific as ever, having released her 55th album earlier this year — Grammy Award-winning singer-songwriter Judy Collins will perform select pieces from her *Wildflowers in Full Bloom* album with the Brevard Festival Orchestra, along with some of Judy's most beloved songs from her decades-spanning oeuvre.

#### La Bohème

Beloved the world over, *La Bohème* portrays the story of two young lovers who battle poverty and illness in their struggle to triumph against all odds. A classic tale of tragic romance, Puccini's score contains some of the most beautiful melodies, heart-wrenching arias, and famous moments ever seen on the operatic stage.

## Sunday, July 14 @ 3:00 PM

#### **The Planets**

Keith Lockhart conducts Brevard's gifted High School students in Gustav Holst's celestial orchestral suite. Holst assigns musical characters to each planet as they relate to their astrological descriptions, and uses the richness and diversity of the large orchestra to paint "a series of mood pictures." Works by Errollyn Wallen and Samuel Coleridge-Taylor open the concert, giving the program a decidedly British accent.

## Copland 3

BMC alumnus André Raphel returns to conduct a program of works spanning three centuries. Dvořák's Violin Concerto, first played in 1883, is graceful, expressive, and folksy in nature. Jessie Montgomery's *Hymn for Everyone* was commissioned by the Chicago Symphony and premiered in 2022. Aaron Copland's 3rd Symphony, often regarded as the "great American Symphony," received its first performance by the Boston Symphony in 1946. Copland's famous *Fanfare for the Common Man* serves as the theme of the last movement.

#### BMC Presents: Aoife O'Donovan in Concert with Orchestra

Grammy-award winner Aoife O'Donovan radiates with a timeless charm and contemporary allure that defies genre. Her distinctive sound weaves together intricate melodies and introspective lyrics. Along with favorites from throughout her career, Aoife performs *America, Come*, a new work for orchestra, choir, and vocals inspired by the lives, letters, and speeches of suffragist Carrie Chapman Catt, in which she explores the nation's evolution through her compassionate songwriting and voice.
