Anthony McGill, Pacifica Quartet, and Caroline Shaw headline a powerful week at Brevard Music Center

BREVARD, N.C. (July 8, 2025) — Brevard Music Center's Summer Festival presents a week of musical power featuring internationally acclaimed guest artists, major symphonic works, and bold contemporary voices—including two performances by **Pulitzer Prize-winning composer and vocalist Caroline Shaw.**

On **Friday, July 18, at 7:30 p.m.**, the Brevard Music Center Orchestra presents **Mozart, Brahms, & Shaw**, with **Anthony McGill, principal clarinet of the New York Philharmonic** and BMC's 2025 Tom Bolton Artist Chair, performing Mozart's Clarinet Concerto. Conductor Mei-Ann Chen leads the program, which also includes Brahms's Symphony No. 2 and *The Observatory* by Caroline Shaw.

"At Brevard, we believe in teaching the canon, as well as introducing students to new voices at the forefront of musical creativity," said **Nick Tzavaras, Senior Director of Artistic Planning and Educational Programs.** "Caroline Shaw represents that future. She's not only one of the most important composers of her generation—she's here, on campus, engaging with students and sharing her work in real-time."

McGill also appears earlier in the week on **Monday, July 14, at 7:30 p.m.** in Parker Concert Hall for **Mozart Clarinet Quintet**, performing that beloved chamber work alongside faculty artists. The evening also includes music by William Bolcom and Mozart's Flute Quartet in D major.

On Wednesday, July 16, at 7:30 p.m., the GRAMMY-winning Pacifica Quartet makes its Brevard debut with a program of chamber masterworks by Samuel Barber, Béla Bartók, and Ludwig van Beethoven.

French Masters, on **Saturday, July 19, at 7:30 p.m.**, features cellist Tae-Yeon Kim with conductor Mei-Ann Chen and the Brevard Sinfonia. The evening includes Poulenc's ballet *Les biches*, Saint-Saëns's Cello Concerto No. 1, and Lutosławski's virtuosic Concerto for Orchestra.

The week concludes on **Sunday, July 20, at 3 p.m.**, with **Shostakovich Symphony No. 5**, conducted by Ken Lam and performed by the Brevard Concert Orchestra. **Caroline Shaw appears as vocalist in her own work** *Is a Rose*, and the program opens with Borodin's *Polovtsian Dances*.
